**District Commissioner** –Jose Solera

Jim Edgerton and Kevin Rumsey presented updates in Jose's absence. There are still five units that have not completed rechartering for this year. They will be dropped at the end of the month if they do not complete the paperwork.

#### Advancement – Chair – Ray Anderson

Ray presented several updates from the last council advancements meeting.

- Some types of projects will no longer be accepted for Eagle service projects including: projects that are solely to clean up an area (like picking up storm debris) and blood donation drives.
- There is a new Eagle rank application.
- There was a reminder that all Eagle service projects must be done for a non-profit entity. Nursing homes and assisted living centers that are operated by for profit corporations are not eligible.
- Council may be mandating that all Eagle Boards of Review be run at the district level instead of the unit level. Mawat is one of the few districts that still have unit level Eagle BOR.

The main public library will be having an event on August 15<sup>th</sup> that will be another good PR/recruiting venue.

Aaron will be speaking with the PTA in July to discuss getting recruiting materials distributed through the schools.

There was not much response on the poll of how spring recruiting went and what tools were effective. There was some discussion of providing more yard signs or banners, but it is unclear where funds to support this would come from.

It was suggested that Aaron coordinate with Jose and use the commissioner corps as another method to get information out the unit leaders.

**Finance - Chair – Stewart Norman**

Kevin Rumsey provided updates in Stewart’s absence. The council has agreed to set our goal to \$36,000. WE are currently at 62% of our goal.

The guest for the major gifts breakfast cancelled on us, so we are working to reschedule that event. We need to generate the list of people who contributed last year, but have not contributed yet this year.

**OA advisor – Warren Pusak**

Rick relayed Warren’s written report. Highlights include:

- At Spring Inductions the chapter was likened to a “mini-lodge” with 71 electees.
- Scout Night at the Bulls was a big success. Suggestions for next year include even more PR, demos like pinewood derby or bat boxes, more signage, etc.
- OA helped out at Relay for Life. This is something Warren feels strongly about and would like to see a much better showing from the units next year.
- OA provided their usual crucial help with cub day camp set up and breakdown. Two of the OA members had heat exhaustion, but are fine now. The Wednesday night pow-wow should start earlier next year.
- The chapter is astronomically ahead in the Roth Awards scoring with 4054 points already (compared to last year’s total of 3667).
